- Co-organized by France and Costa Rica
 - \circ 9-13 June 2025, Nice
 - \circ Green zone open to civil society and international exhibits
- Preceded by 3 UN special events:
 - One Ocean Science Congress jointly organized by CNRS and Ifremer (Nice)
 - Blue Economy and Finance Forum (Monaco)
 - Ocean rise and resilience: Coastal Cities and Regions facing sea level rise, organized by Nice Métropole (Nice)







Themes, One Ocean Science Congress



- T1: Integrating knowledge systems, with a focus on responsibility and respect for the ocean
- T2: Effectiveness, equitability and safety of ocean-based approaches to reach the mitigation and adaptation goals of the Paris Agreement
- T3: Protection and restoration of marine and coastal ecosystems to ensure sustainable and equitable management
- T4: Knowledge of the deep ocean and ways to enable its sustainable use
- T5: Marine genetic resources: from discovery to equitable access and sharing of associated benefits


- T6: Transparency in the fisheries sector, including illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing
- T7: Sustainability, equitability, and safety of ocean-based food systems
- T8: Marine plastic pollution
- T9: Maritime transport and decarbonization of shipping



 - 5-10 withdrawals from US researchers


• Final Presentation Counts:
